Barb not only manned the recording process each week, but wowed us with creative and relevant children's messages, delivered with her impressive teaching skills. Going forward, the new system will allow us to continue online viewership for the wider community and those unable to attend Chapel in person.

Election of Trustees and Calling the Minister for 2021

Following the committee reports at the Annual Meeting, the following names were submitted for Board of Trustees membership, Class of 2023: Judy Bean, Katy Beltz, Dan Conable, Barbara Morgan, Pat Sturges, Susan Taylor, and John View. The complete slate was elected. Dan Conable was nominated and elected Clerk. Treasurer John View proposed Peters and Associates as auditors, and their selection was confirmed by a vote of the membership. Reverend Richard McCaughey was called as summer minister for the 2021 season.

Facilities

Chairs Brian Johnston & Judy Bean

Chapel. Dan Conable reported on behalf of Brian Johnston that the contractor is scheduled to replace the deteriorating front steps in September. At that time, we will also evaluate the condition of mortar on sides of the Chapel that remain to be addressed, with a view of giving the Finance Committee a projection for completion of this work over the next few years. We will also evaluate what may need to be done with the sea wall at the Manse at that time. The pump supplying water to the Chapel burned out and has been replaced, with a lowwater shut-off switch to protect it if water in the well drops too far. The new sound and video system has been installed and is functioning well, with a few more technical issues to be addressed. We hope to have a simple set of directions posted on the wall above the equipment in the back stairwell so that anyone can operate the system for recording a worship service or other events.

Manse. Judy Bean reported that we've had some problems with the trees on the Manse property. A pine tree came down earlier in the season, and was removed by Dan Levi. Dan also delivered 4 cords of wood to the Manse. There is one more tree we're waiting to have Dan Levi come and check. A branch came down and hit the roof, but no damage to the roof.

Finance and Budget

Treasurer John View

Due to the COVID pandemic, we were forced to abandon our approved budget for 2019-2020 and move to an "austerity" type budget to be able to financially cope. To date we have been successful at holding expenses down and extremely thankful for the generosity of so many.

Current cash on hand is \$24,849 for the Chapel and \$12,230 for Memorial Woods. All the bills have been paid, and therefore we should close the fiscal year on a positive note. Gifts from donors for Chapel operating support so far for 2019-2020 is \$16,509 compared to \$4,630 for the preceding year. Plate is currently at \$15,779 with 2 Sundays to go.

It should be noted that we did not draw any funds from our endowment this year. Budget 2020-2021 has been sent to the website. It is projected for a "normal" year, though no one knows what the future holds.

Bill Locke provided an update on endowments. The endowment now stands at \$1.34 million, distributed within policy parameters established by the Finance Committee. As of June, the amount was down only 1.19%, compared to a 3% drop in the market as a whole, and we have seen a 4.17% increase for the whole year.

Flowers

We had 17 arrangements this summer over 10 weeks. I am grateful to those who contributed flowers to our virtual services. Many flower sponsors donated their arrangements to people on our Sunshine list. It was wonderful to cheer people up with flowers, and I have received a number of notes of thanks. Thanks to Kate at Mountain Greenery for her beautiful flowers and photographs and to Susan Taylor for artfully including them in the services.

Gifts and Memorials

Memorial Sunday was held on August 9, 2020. In this year of virtual services it is particularly meaningful to recognize those who have passed away this past year. The individuals remembered were: Roger Munsell, Harrison Bicknell, Jr., Robert "Bob" Binyon, Henry "Hank" Wightman, Jr., Thomas Moore, and Donald Mawhinney, Jr.

Hopefully, next year we will be able to resume normal procedures for recognizing and recording memorial gifts to the Chapel. Memorial Sunday is tentatively scheduled to be August 8, 2021.

Historical

The Trustees decided in May to keep the Chapel closed for the 2020 season due to the coronavirus pandemic. No activities were to be held at the Chapel, and several weddings, baptisms, and memorial services were cancelled, along with the Bazaar, historical lectures, and Tuesday tours.

Donations from members plus a balance provided a reduced, although sufficient amount to fund the Chapel for 2020. Expenses were less along with income. The Chapel is blessed with high-caliber volunteers to handle the usual jobs plus the added chores of producing a 60-minute video of a worship service each week. Our website and social media have been the glue which has kept everything running led by President Sara Burrows and the Executive Committee. Webmaster Susan Taylor deserves particular mention. Dick McCaughey's flexibility, suggestions, and cooperation have been noteworthy, too.

Historical Lectures

Craig reported that Kate at the Town of Webb Historical Society had planned a full program of lectures before the pandemic forced cancellation of events of this sort. She has contacted all the speakers from that list, and they have agreed to speak next year, if circumstances permit.

Insurance

There were no changes from the report in the spring newsletter.

Legal Affairs

No report as the Chapel has no legal activities at this time.

Mathias Music Endowment Fund

The Mathias Music Endowment Fund was established in memory of Fred and Cleta Mathias. The funds are to perpetuate the strong music programs of the Chapel, to encourage talent in the arts, and to subsidize Chapel musical performances. Interest earned on the Fund, to be distributed this year, is \$1300.

In keeping with the missions of the Fund, this year the committee agreed to donate: \$700 to Olivia Phaneuf, of

In past years some Mathias award recipients have contributed special music to a service in the Chapel. Unable to do that live this year, three of the award recipients—Kate Whalley, Olivia Phaneuf, and Sterling Brownell—have submitted videos of their performances to the webmaster, Susan Taylor, and she has included them in the July and August services.

Membership

There are 346 families in our database. These records are updated frequently from mailing corrections generated by Martha Widdicombe, Mary Moore, Judy Bean, Sue Taylor, and John View.

Of the 346, we have emails for 100 families. Note—we only use one name from a couple even though both may have entered their emails in the Chapel Web pages.

This brings up another issue. In the Web pages there are an additional 99 names that are NOT in our database. While these people may receive newsletters and other mailings via email, we cannot always be sure we are able to track them if they change email addresses.

While some might hope that we can do everything via the Web, the fact remains that a large portion of our database has older folks who do not always use the web on a regular basis. Or, their local internet is so weak, that they can't view Chapel web events at all.

Memorial Woods

Outreach

Due to the COVID 19 pandemic the Outreach Committee decided to be proactive, realizing that some nonprofits may be in financial crisis. We convened, researched, and prioritized needs among our outreach partners in less than one week. This year's allocation was distributed early and reflected significant changes. Some organizations did not need any funding, largely because they were not able to continue operations, while others needed whatever we could give them. The list of donations was in the spring newsletter.

Our allocation of \$9,188.50 reflects a reduction of \$560.50 from 2019. This is the second consecutive year with a reduction. For now that will meet our needs, but if additional funding is requested by any of our partners, the Outreach Committee will evaluate the need and, if appropriate, come to the board to request additional funding. These are NOT normal times. On August 20, BMCC volunteered at Hope House, safely cooking and handing out the take-home meals. There were only four of us but we did a good job and all went well. Christmas Service. A decision has not been made yet regarding the Christmas service. In case we need to cancel, we will be recording an online Christmas service Labor Day weekend.


